

Thame Remembers House Plaques update Nov 23

The Individual House Plaques project aims to place a small cast metal plaque at the house in Thame of each service man who died for his country in either World War, but only where an association with that house can be identified beyond reasonable doubt.

Currently eighty nine names have been identified across seventy eight addresses in the older parts of Thame. By the end of October we will have fitted fifty one plaques at forty nine addresses commemorating fifty five names (see over for where!), with a further ten to be fitted during November. Leaving nineteen plaques commemorating twenty four men still to be taken up.

Since our original publication more historical data, like the 1921 census, has been made available and so we have taken the opportunity to re-address the research to be absolutely certain that we have identified the correct houses.
