

Plaques are only placed where the original property still exists, and where we have evidence beyond reasonable doubt that it was the home or workplace of the man identified.

The plaques are designed in a cast metal oval shape, each one measuring only 145mm x 90mm.

Each plaque is sited so that it can be seen from a public viewpoint without any invasion of the householder's privacy.

Please respect the householder's privacy.

The installed plaques are identified on the map on the inside of this leaflet, the location of each one is marked with a red dot.

At the time of World War One Thame was much smaller than it is now and so the locations are in the older parts of the town such as, Church Road, North Street, and Chinnor Road.

By the time of the Second World War new estates had been built and plaques are now also located in Horton Avenue, Hampden Avenue and Broadwaters Avenue.



There are 212 names recorded in the Thame Remembers project and our research has successfully identified an existing property for 96 of these names, across 84 addresses. As at May 2024, 66 plaques have been installed on 64 properties remembering 71 men. Efforts are continuing to complete the installation of plaques for identified names, and research is on going to identify additional locations.



Some plaques like this one in the High Street contain two names.

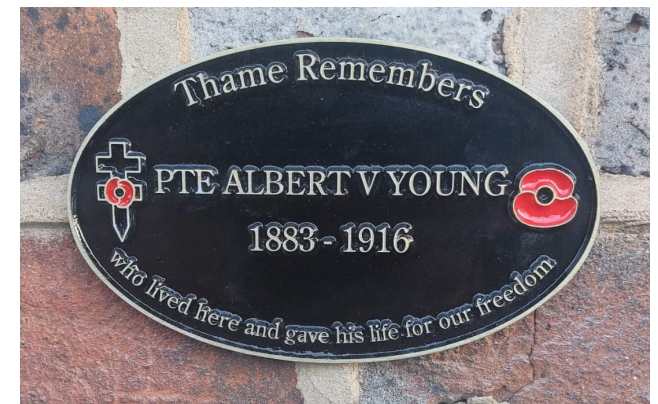


Thame Remembers

House Plaques

The Thame Remembers House Plaques project seeks to ensure that the men from Thame who gave their lives in conflict are never forgotten, by installing a small plaque at a property where each one lived or with which they were associated.

It is hoped that linking names to properties will prompt people to identify with the sacrifice on a more personal level and may encourage the continued observance of Remembrance through future generations, whilst also adding to the town's history and heritage.
